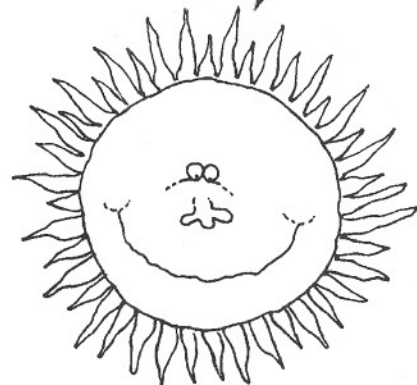
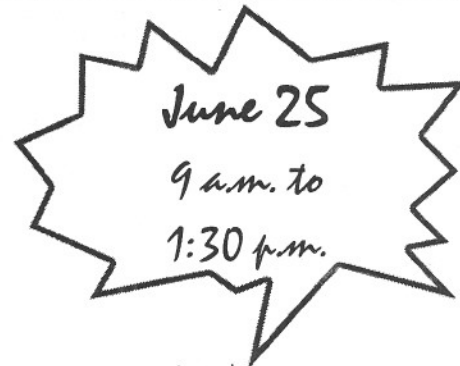

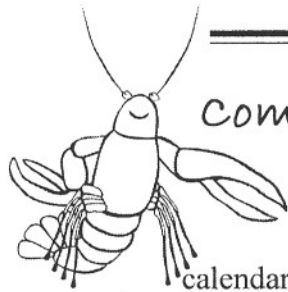

from a new PBS documentary.

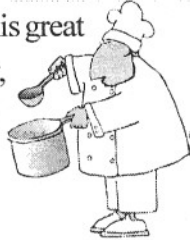

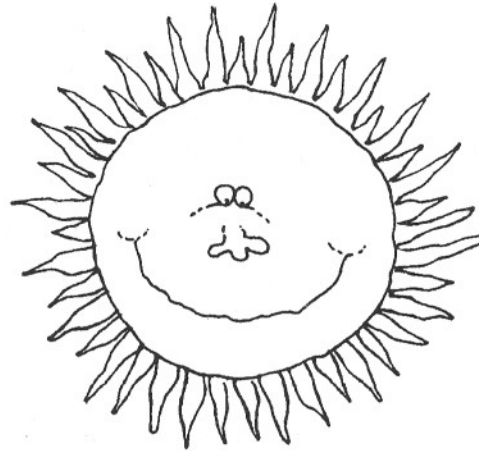
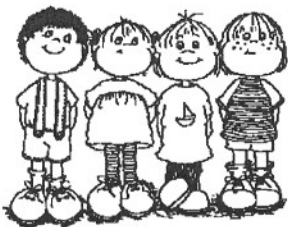

through September 4.

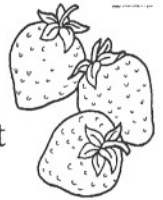
The Board of Christian

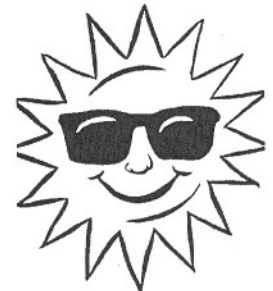

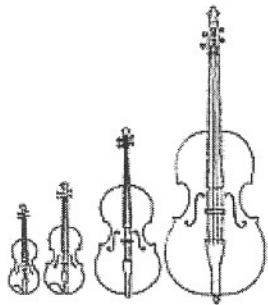

The program will include a mix of music, including Zydeco, Taiweneese, Fiddle, Bulgarian, Gypsy, Salsa, and Bossa Nova.

Tickets for the 7:00 p.m. concert on Saturday, August 6, will go on sale June 26 for \$15 each.

Members of the critically acclaimed Boston String Quartet have been thrilling audiences from coast to coast with their unique compositions and daring approach. The quartet performs its members' own arrangements of classical chamber music, rock, jazz, world music, and more.

The BSQ has collaborated with John Mayer, the Boston Ballet, Fionnuala Gill, Giorgia Fumanti,

Jennifer Holliday, Lisa Fisher, Tim Janis, and Dave Fiuczynski. The group has played for the Los Angeles Music Awards, PBS, and Yankee Homecoming Festival.

Committed to music education in New England, the BSQ members are currently Ensemble-in-Residence at School of Groove, a contemporary music school. The quartet participates in multiple education tours each year, during which the group works with high school music programs in workshops, master classes, rehearsals, and performance.
